Revelation is one of those biblical books we can be tempted to avoid. Its odd and even disturbing imagery can make it quite an uncomfortable and perplexing read. But this pastoral letter, written by an elder sage to a diverse group of committed yet messy, tired, hurting and confused churches can actually offer us a lot of comfort and instruction about how to live hopefully, faithfully and lovingly as God's people today, however challenging a time and place we might find ourselves in.

We've produced a host of resources to help you and your churches chew over the text of Revelation in a host of different ways together; appreciating its strangeness, hearing its encouragement and responding to its challenges. This year's menu includes short Animations on each theme, a Reading Guide, a Bible Journaling Kit, and our usual 30 Days with Revelation booklet filled with study notes, small group session plans and all-age worship activities.



Christmas Cracker



The service celebrates stories of the Methodist community offering welcome, hospitality and support to people who are displaced, forced to migrate and seeking a new life.

Warm Spaces – funding and volunteers

If you're running a Warm Space this winter, please do register with <u>Warm Welcome</u> – it helps local people find your space and is used by social, community and health workers for referring people.

In addition, Warm Welcome are launching a service to help you find and recruit <u>volunteers</u> for your Warm Space. Even if you have 'enough' volunteers, offering this opportunity can be a great way of including more people in your church community – whether it's young people doing their Duke of Edinburgh award, those looking to make new connections post-lockdown, or others who want to help out in the cost-of-living crisis.

Finally, Co-op and Crowdfunder are offering Warm Spaces up to £5,000 in matched funding to resource your space (as well as the possibility of £500 to get you going!). If you have not yet applied for funding, start your application <u>here</u>.

Homes for Ukraine

Methodists for Ukraine is a project to enable Methodists to support Ukrainians through refugee sponsorship. The need for hosts to come forward remains high, but the supply is running low.
