Visit of the Vice President of the Methodist Church in Britain to the MK Circuit

On Sunday 19th March the Milton Keynes Circuit welcomed the Vice President of the Methodist Church in Britain, Mr Anthony Boateng.

The Vice President preached at a Circuit Service held at Queensway Methodist Church that was attended by members from circuit churches and LEPs, both ministers and lay. The uplifting message preached by Mr Boateng was based on a Theme of "Revival", with Bible readings from Acts 2: 4 - 21 read by John



Careford a member of Freeman Methodist Church and a Local Preacher. The second reading was read by a Queensway Sunday school pupil Samuel Atieku who read Luke 7: 18 -28. In his address he emphasised the need for the Methodist Church both local and national to engage in Revival in order to fulfil its calling. The Vice President also commended the presence of groups such as the MCZF and Ghanaian Fellowships in the Circuit as a positive start in reviving our churches.

The Queensway Choir led the procession, with prayers from Rev Nicola Vidamour and Mrs Jacqueline Commey and the Benediction from the host minister, The Rev Edson Dube. After the service, the gathering was treated to food from different cultures represented in our churches provided generously by the Queensway Women's Fellowship and MCZF Manyano/Ruwadzano.

Deanshanger Methodist Church

Lent 2023: Love in Action

Instead of a bible study during Lent we invited four people to give a short talk about the area in which they have experience which shows 'Love in Action'. This was delivered in an informal setting with coffee, and was followed by a discussion.

The aim was to show how Christians have put their faith into action and was based on the passage in Matthew 25: 31-46 vv 35-36 'For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat. I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in. I needed clothes and you clothed me. I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me'



The Four sessions were taken by:

- Joy Chapman with her display of Fairtrade goods.
- Don Head from The Christian Foundation based at Wolverton which offers innovative learning opportunities within their eight social enterprises for young people 15-25 years.
- Ian Anderson from MK Money Lifeline, a charity since 2012, which offers debt advice for anyone in need in Milton Keynes.
- Rev Wendy Carey's talk 'Life in Prison' gave us a graphic insight into her dedicated chaplaincy work in several prisons over many years.



Queensway Methodist Church

Messy Church took place in March in the Church Hall, led by Jane Brough, our Family Worker, assisted by Mike, Steve, Jean, Peter and Ken. We welcomed 46 parents and children to our first Messy Church. We shared the Easter story with them and provided family fun and games, Easter craft activities, songs, and a hot meal. It was a great success! Thank you to everyone involved in our mission to share the love of God with people in our community.

During Easter week Queensway hosted several visits from Knowles school. We welcomed 130 children, plus staff, into our Church. Jane talked with them about Easter, engaged them in an activity, showed them a video explaining the Easter story and we all joined in with two action songs on the screen—Our God is a Great Big God and Oh Happy Day. The children and staff very much appreciated the visits.

At the end of March a group of children from Knowles School came to do some more work on



the garden. They did some weeding and planted some potatoes in the raised beds. This is an ongoing project with Knowles School.

Queensway will be celebrating the Coronation of King Charles III with a traditional Afternoon Tea on Saturday 6th May.

Following the success of our first Café Worship, we are planning to continue these on the 4th Sunday of every month

Very likely, he too will be thinking about his vocation. The lectionary readings this year invite us to consider that our vocations do not happen in isolation, but as part of work that God has done and is doing. The writers of the 2023 Vocations worship materials ask: "As we see Charles III building on that which has come before, we ask, What are we called to do which builds on what God has done before in our communities?" The <u>materials</u> offer a whole service outline, with an all-age talk, a sermon, prayers and, of course, hymn suggestions. This content might act as launch pad for one's own reflections, or could be used as it is, as a local arrangement.




Spring Issue of the connexion magazine

HMP Volunteer Opportunities

In every community, there are people who are out of sight and out of mind behind prison walls. It is important that they are treated fairly and humanely and that they are helped to change and reintegrate into society because, at some point, perhaps very soon, they will return to those communities.

So, in every community, there are also Independent Monitoring Boards or IMBs: members of the public, appointed by ministers, with unrestricted access to a nearby prison and those within it. They work with others, contributing their own experience and gaining new skills. They gain a unique insight into what can make prisons, and therefore society, a better place.
