#### **Newton Longville Free Church**



Warm Welcome Space - This initiative was started in November 2022 - then Warm Space - and is held in our Church but is an initiative of the Church and the Parish Council with volunteers from a broad cross section of the local community. We provide our Church premises from 09:00 to 15:00 every Wednesday. It started a little slowly but we now get up to 50 people every week, these include members of the community who want company, need a warm space in winter and get offered coffee, tea, cakes and at lunch time a bowl of soup and a roll. Because of its success we decided to continue into the summer because of the need for people to be able to meet and spend time together as a community. The initiative was started by Sue Sparling one of our Church members who with the Parish Council sourced volunteers and funds to get off the ground. It is now running well with the funds made available and donations in cash and goods. We are very grateful for all those who attend, those who volunteer and especially those who help fund us, so to you all thank you very much.

Every Tuesday from 10:00 to 12:00 Sue also runs a "Coffee Morning" where the local community can come along and enjoy a natter and a cup of coffee, tea and some cake or biscuits. This has been running for quite a few years and is still as popular as ever.

Sue – again - also runs a **"Songs and Rhymes"** group for infants up to 4 years with mothers in attendance where the toddlers have fun and are kept busy with art projects, colouring story reading and singing. This group is popular in the Village with up to 15 toddlers attending with their Mums.

To the future we are celebrating our **20**<sup>th</sup> **anniversary of the opening of the Newton Longville Church** and this will be celebrated with a special service on 20<sup>th</sup> August 2023, led by Rev Edson Dube followed by a bring and share "brunch". We will also be holding our "Harvest" celebratory service on the first Sunday of September; this will be led by Sue Sparling.

#### **METHODIST NEWS**

**New President and Vice President** - The Revd Gill Newton has been elected and inducted as President of the Methodist Conference alongside Vice-President, Deacon Kerry Scarlett. The induction took place on Saturday 24 June at the Hilton Birmingham Metropole, during the Methodist Conference. They both talk about what treasure looks like in our personal lives and how we can find it in our communities and churches.

#### **Presidential Designates**



The Methodist Conference has elected the Revd Helen Cameron to serve as President and Mrs Carolyn Godfrey to serve as Vice-President, starting their year of office with the Representative Session of the Methodist Conference in Leeds in June 2024. **Dealing with Conflict** - The Methodist Conference has voted to roll out a scheme to help resolve disputes in church communities across the Church following a successful pilot project. The Conference adopted the recommendation for the five-year programme, in partnership with Place for Hope, to offer an integrated approach in support of Positive Working Together and extending the Reconciliation and Mediation Team as a Connexion-wide programme. The Reconciliation and Mediation Team Pilot Project is run with Place for Hope and started two and a half years ago in three regions, with 18 mediators now qualified to work on the project.

A Justice Seeking Church - The report from the Walking with Micah project, A Justice-Seeking Church was taken to the Methodist Conference this year. This report outlines why we do justice, what we do, and how we do it, all as part of the Methodist Church. Join a webinar, listen to the audio version and read a summary of the report here.

The Methodist Conference has overwhelmingly voted to recommit the Methodist Church to being a Justice-seeking Church. The report received by the Conference hopes to encourage more Methodists in acting for justice, along with their local communities, and to focus

efforts on contributing to change in key areas including poverty, refugees, the environment, discrimination and peace. More information on the Circuit website, News page.
